Auntie Jane wondered how to get Emmie to smile. She tried gathering lots of beautiful flowers for Emmie to look at.
















Cousin Frank wondered how to get Emmie to smile. He tried making silly faces with his friends.










 Great Grandma Mae wondered how to get Emmie to smile.
She tried finding plenty of delicious foods for Emmie to eat.








Nana Sheila and Poppy Joe wondered how to get Emmie to smile. They tried giving her lots of toys.
