smile.**



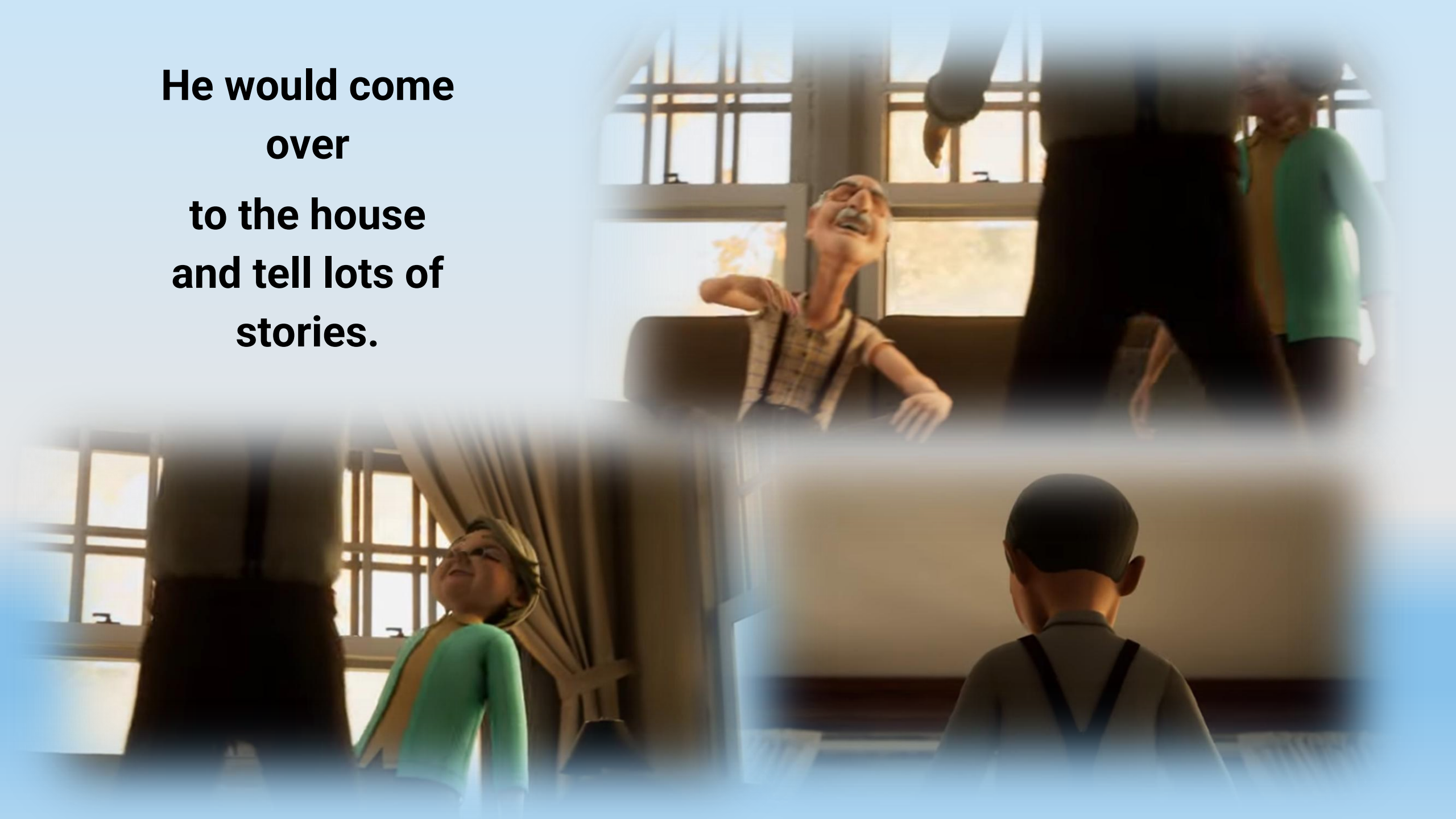


**Cousin Frank had a

toy.**





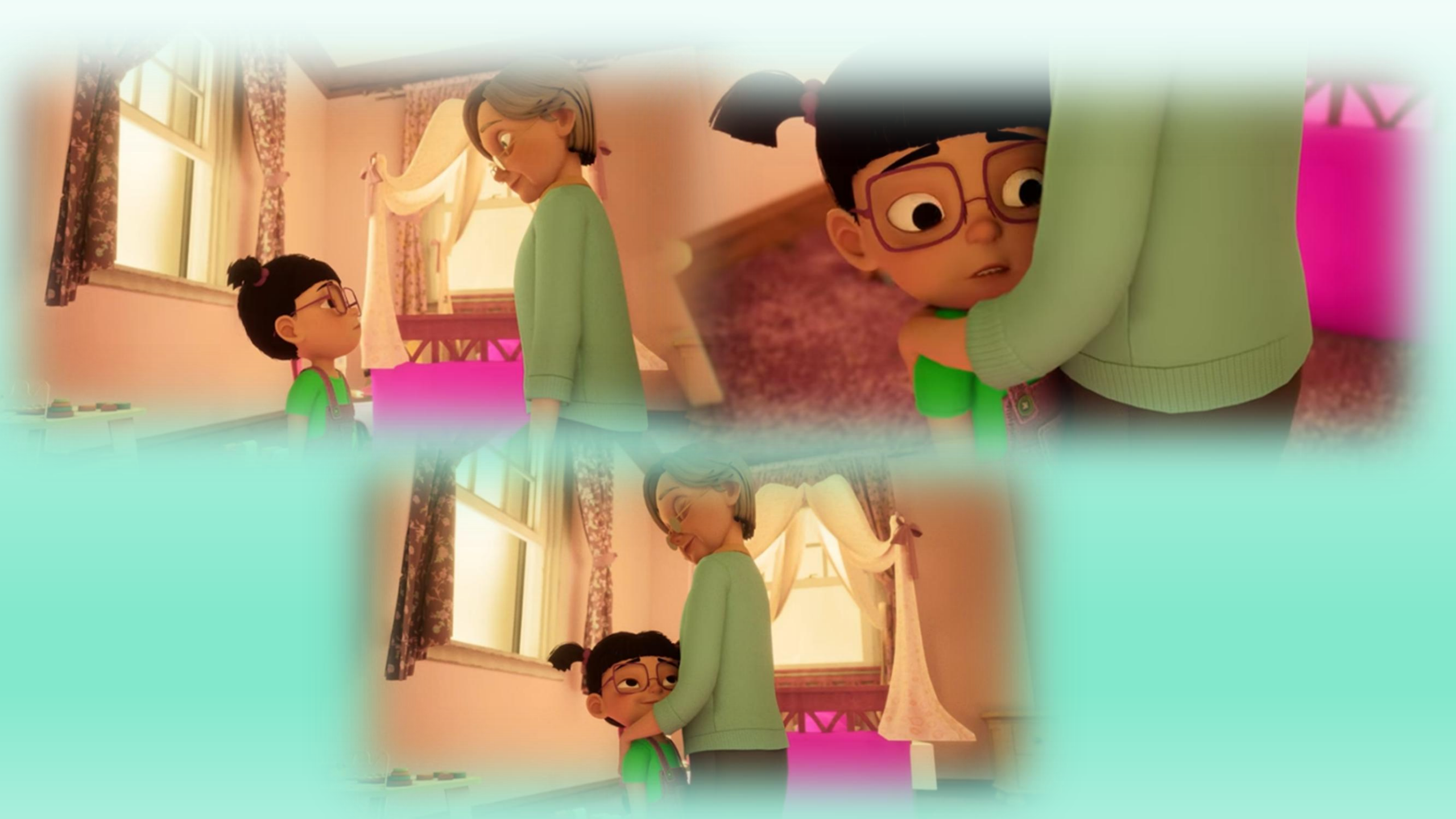
**Nothing they
